Quotations from authors, as well as English terms and expressions, should be in double quotation marks, unless they are longer than 3 lines, in which case see the JB Guidelines' "Layout" rules. Translations of cited forms, e.g., of Chinese examples translated into English, should be in single quotation marks. All commas and periods go inside both single and double quotation marks.

All book and article titles (cited in text or in the reference list) should be given in sentence format, with the first word capitalized. Journal titles should be given in italics, and in headline format, with all major words capitalized. Book titles should be in italics. Chinese book titles, however, do not require italics.

Please use commas between name and year in in-text citations. Follow the example at the end of this sentence: (Smith, 1996). If there is a page number, use the following as a model (Smith, 1996, p. 218). If there are multiple authors, use semicolons to separate them (Smith, 1996; Jones, 2005; Miller, 2016). At the end of the review, list the references cited, and include your mailing and email addresses. Please use the APA format. See below for a sample.

Use single spacing throughout the review. Use Times New Roman, 12-point font. Use "justify text" alignment.

Please keep your review between 3-5 (1200-2000 words) pages with the above formatting applied. Please comment on both the strengths of the books/materials you are reviewing and areas to improve.
